

## About Us

Jennifer's Pet Rescue is a no-kill, not-for-profit, animal rescue organization located in Dallas, GA. We are licensed through both Paulding county and the state of Georgia. We are also recognized as a 501(c)(3) organization.

Our mission is to rescue and re-home adoptable dogs and cats who would otherwise be euthanized. Most of our animals come from local animal shelters. Others are surrendered by loving owners who can no longer care for their pets. Due to local laws we are not permitted to accept stray animals. For the safety of our guests we cannot accept feral animals, dog-aggressive dogs, or Pit Bulls. Proof of ownership is required. If we cannot accept your animal we are happy to try and help you find another rescue who can.

## About Our Pets

All Jennifer's pets undergo full veterinarian workups upon arrival. All cats and kittens are tested for Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV), Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), and rabies as is age appropriate. All dogs are tested for and vaccinated against heartworms, distemper, and rabies. All puppies are dewormed, tested for parvo, and vaccinated as is age appropriate. Animals with illnesses or injuries are medically treated as applicable.

All animals receive monthly flea and heartworm preventative. All animals are certified "adoptable" by the kind veterinarians at East Paulding Animal Hospital before they are promoted for adoption. All animals currently available for adoption are listed on the Dogs & Puppies and Cats & Kittens for Adoption pages of our Web site.

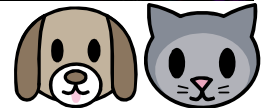

## Information for New Cat or Kitten Owners

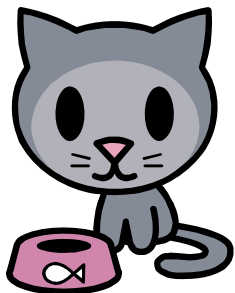
Prior to adoption, all Jennifer's pets undergo complete veterinarian work ups. All cats and kittens are tested for Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV), Feline Immunodeficiency Virus (FIV), and rabies and are vaccinated as is appropriate for their age. They are also given monthly flea preventative.

If you adopt a newborn kitten that has not had all three rounds of shots, it is the new owner's responsibility to ensure the kitten receives its final shots.

## General Medical & Safety Information



**Car Rides:** Animals should never be left unattended in cars. Even with the windows down, cars are not very well ventilated and the animal will become dehydrated quickly in the heat or hypothermic in the cold. Either condition can prove fatal for an animal much faster than for a human. It is strongly suggested that animals travel in travel crates and not be allowed to roam freely in the vehicle.

**Supervision & Crating:** It is strongly suggested that all dogs be crated when their owners are not home. To prevent choking while unattended, dogs should not be allowed to take rawhide bones or other treats that break apart into their crates when no one is home. It's a proven fact: properly crated dogs cannot destroy your house or eat your shoes in your absence. Generally, it is not necessary to crate cats in an owners absence.

**Training & Discipline:** There are many, many ways to train and discipline animals. Jennifer's Pet Rescue uses positive reinforcement techniques. PetSmart offers a variety of training courses from new animal orientation to house training to advanced preparation for Canine Good Citizen Certificates. When disciplining an animal, the general rule of thumb is this: if you would not subject a two-year-old child to a specific form of discipline, it is not appropriate for your pet either.

**Abuse & Neglect:** If you suspect any animal (not just dogs or cats) is being abused or neglected please contact your local Animal Control Officer.

## Information for New Dog or Puppy Owners

Prior to adoption, all Jennifer's pets undergo complete veterinarian workups. All dogs are tested for and vaccinated against heartworms, distemper, and rabies. All puppies are dewormed, tested for parvo, and vaccinated as appropriate for their age.

If you adopt a newborn puppy that has not had all three rounds of shots, it is the new owner's responsibility to ensure the puppy receives its final shots.
